
What is Exotic Caulerpa?

- o Caulerpa (Caulerpa brachypus and Caulerpa parvifolia) are exotic (non-native) seaweeds that compete with native species for space and smother shellfish beds
- o It is the kikuyu grass of the ocean, spreading rapidly to form dense beds or meadows
- o Exotic caulerpa upsets the balance of local ecosystems



Why is it important to respond early?

- New Zealand's recreational, cultural, and commercial marine activities are at risk
- Some people question whether Caulerpa can be eradicated or not, but one community in Florida has achieved eradication, so we believe we can too
- Rapidly spreading in our climate and clear waters means we must continually work to stay on top of it
- Long term community collaboration and continual action are required






























Blair Tuke dive at Omakiwi Bay



Blair Tuke - Live Oceans America's Cup Winner New Zealand Olympian

Blair said in the 'Sunday' programme:

"It was terrifying seeing what I saw"
